GOLF CART FIRE SAFETY






Charge or fuel your golf cart in a well-ventilated area.



Stay home while charging your golf cart.
Never charge overnight.



Never use a damaged charging cord or extension cord.



Follow manufacturer's instructions for charging and maintaining your golf cart.



Install a carbon monoxide (CO) alarm in your home. If your alarm sounds, get out and call 9-1-1 immediately.



Fuel your golf cart when it is cool. Store fuel in an appropriate container. Clean any fuel spills immediately.



Batteries used in electric golf carts emit hydrogen when charging. Hydrogen is a colorless, odorless, highly flammable gas. Even a small amount of hydrogen can cause an explosion.
